How to Avoid Utilities Scams

When temperatures drop, it often costs more to stay cozy in your home — and scammers know that. And they know how to take advantage of that too. Utility imposters work year-round, but they really shine around the winter holidays.

Here's how to recognize these bad guys:

- Scammers say you're behind on your bill and, unless you
 pay right away by gift card or wiring money through
 companies like Western Union or MoneyGram, they will
 shut off your utility service. Stop! That's a scam!
- Fraudsters knock on your door saying they need to repair or replace equipment, and that you have to pay on the spot. Don't let them in! That's a scam!
- Con artists inform you that you overpaid your bill, and they only need to confirm your personal information to process your refund quickly. Bah humbug! That's a scam!

If you encounter a situation like this, notify your utility company and also report it to the FTC at ReportFraud.ftc.gov.

Cutting Energy Costs

The less you're worried about energy costs, perhaps the easier it will be to ignore a call from someone (a scammer) pretending to offer ways for you to save or get money this winter.

- Do a home energy audit. It will tell you how efficient your heating system is and where your home is wasting energy. Many utility companies offer free or low-cost energy assessments.
- Seal air leaks around windows, doors and places where pipes and wires come through walls. Check caulking and weatherstripping for gaps or cracks, and then fix them.
- Lower the thermostat before you go to bed or leave for the day, or get a programmable thermostat to do it automatically.
- Increase your insulation to levels recommended by the U.S. Department of Energy.
- See if help is available. Determine if you're eligible for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP).
